1. 1.POLICYPURPOSE

This policy articulates the College's commitment to responsible use of natural resources, and lists the areas in which sustainability concepts will receive consideration in decision making.

2. SCOPE/LIMITS

This policy applies to all employees of Selkirk College.

3. PRINCIPLES

Conservation of the natural environment and responsible use of natural resources are highly regarded at Selkirk College. <u>Under the Selkirk College Strategic Plan</u>, <u>Environmental responsibilitysustainability</u> is <u>listed</u> as one of the College'sour core <u>organizational values</u>pillars of success.

We are Selkirk College is committed to implementing practices that promote a healthy natural environment: in <u>itsour</u> teaching activities, <u>our</u>-administration, <u>our</u>-facilities and operations, <u>our</u>-funding allocations and <u>our</u> applied research priorities. <u>The College is We are</u> committed to reducing <u>itsour</u> ecological footprint and creating a culture of sustainability through <u>itsour</u> educational efforts.

IN KEEPING WITH <u>SELKIRK COLLEGE'S OUR VALUESSUSTAINABILITY PILLAR</u>, <u>THE COLLEGEWE</u> WILL:

- A. Incorporate sustainability concepts as a significant priority in Selkirk College decision making, including the development of operational policies.
- B. Encourage environmental responsibility and life-long sustainable practices among all members of the campus community.
- C. Seek alternative practices and procedures to minimize negative impacts of <u>itsour</u> operations on the environment.
- D. Wherever possible, incorporate principles of sustainability across the curriculum in all of <u>itsour</u> educational programming and applied research.

- E. Provide leadership to the College'sour communities on sustainable practices and operations.
- F. Incorporate a continuous improvement and adaptive management approach.
