CARPENTRY ENTRY & CARPENTRY APPRENTICESHIP School of Industry & Trades Training

Our six-month pre-apprencticeship (entry) program combines theory and shop time to complete BC Level 1 technical training. Our six-week apprenticeship program is offered for indentured apprentices seeking Red Seal inter-provincial certification.

ELECTRICAL ENTRY & ELECTRICAL APPRENTICESHIP School of Industry & Trades Training

All four levels of electrical training are offered in cooperation with the Industry Training Authority. Our six-month pre-apprenticeship (entry) program prepares you for residential, commercial and industrial systems through practical training. Ten-week apprenticeship training is offered to indentured apprentices seeking Red Seal inter-provincial qualification.

BC ELECTRICAL CODE

School of Industry & Trades Training

This comprehensive BC Electrical Code course is offered through Distance Education and includes tutorial support. Gain experience in the proper use of the code book and on the correct interpretations of applicable code rules, along with a working knowledge of the British Columbia Safety Standards Act, the British Columbia General Regulation and the Electrical Safety Regulation, and the BC Authorization Procedures for electrical contractors.

ESTHETICS

Get the skills you need for a career in the professional body care industry. Our seven-month provincially accredited certificate program will prepare you to write the examination for the Special Beauty Culture License as required by the Cosmetologists Association of British Columbia.

FINE WOODWORKING

School of Industry & Trades Training

Our graduates receive credit for Level 1 and Level 2 technical training of their Joinery Apprenticeship through our nine-month specialized certificate program, which emphasizes quality design, originality and enhanced workmanship.

HAIRDRESSING

Hairstyling skills and beauty culture are the focus of our nine-month provincially articulated program. Classroom instruction and a hands-on practicum at a commercial salon prepare you to write the examination for the Cosmetology Industry Association of British Columbia Hairdressing Certificate.

GENERAL MECHANICS

Our nine-month program encompasses three mechanical trades: automotive service technician, commercial transport mechanics and heavy duty mechanics. Entry-level training is provided in accordance with the Industry Training Authority guidelines, preparing you to become indentured as an apprentice in your chosen area.

MILLWRIGHT APPRENTICESHIP School of Industry & Trades Training

All four levels of Millwright technical training are provided in cooperation with the Industry Training Authority. Our theory courses will prepare you to become a Journeyperson Millwright by completing the required technical training for Levels 1, 2, 3 and 4.

MILLWRIGHT/MACHINIST School of Industry & Trades Training

Our nine-month entry-level program provides theoretical knowledge and practical shop skills equivalent to the first level of apprenticeship in each of the Millwright and Machinist trades. Upon completion, you are credited with the 1st year of Machinist Technical Training and the 1st and 2nd year of Millwright Technical Training.

REFRIGERATION PLANT OPERATOR School of Industry & Trades Training

This 9-unit course, which approved by the BC Boiler Inspection Branch, is taught entirely through Distance Education. Completion of this course provides students with four months of credit towards the one year of operating time required to write the Provincial Certificate as refrigeration/ice plant operator.

SKILLED TRADES EXPLORATORY PROGRAM (STEP) FOR WOMEN School of Industry & Trades Training

Over the course of this 11-week program, you will gain basic technical knowledge and hands-on skills in the following trades: Electrical, Millwright, Machinist, Welding, Carpentry and General Mechanics. You will also receive certification in Occupational First Aid Level I, Forklift Operation and WHMIS.

SCHOLARSHIPS—Monetary awards for students enrolled in a minimum 80 percent course load who have demonstrated outstanding academic achievement *while attending* Selkirk College. Application deadline: April.

BURSARIES—Monetary awards to eligible students enrolled in a minimum 60 percent course load who have demonstrated *financial need* and who have a minimum grade point average of 2.0. Application deadline: October.

- 2 You can download an application form from our website or apply on-line through the Post Secondary Access Website (PASBC). https://portal.bccampus.ca
- 3 Pay the \$35 non-refundable application processing fee.
- 4 Submit supporting documentation, i.e., official transcripts and any additional program-specific requirements.
- 5 Take the Computerized Placement Test. All first-time applicants are required to take this basic skills assessment of reading and math. Please call the switchboard of the campus nearest you to register, or for instructions on how to take the test online.
