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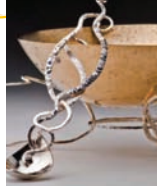
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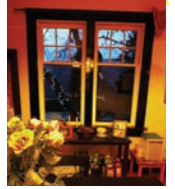
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DIGITAL ARTS STUDENT SHOWCASE

For over 28 years **Peter Wood** has been instructing in the Ski Resort Operations & Management program, with additional teaching duties in the Resort and Hotel and Golf Club Management programs. Peter led the development of a major distance learning project for the Golf and Ski programs.

Along with editing and co-authoring four specialized Golf Management texts, Peter researched and wrote a Ski Resort Risk Management Text and the 483 page Ski Lift Functions, Maintenance and Operations text which are both published through Selkirk College. The Ski Lift Functions text has sold over 1,400 copies in French and English. It is used by all of the other Ski Resort Management programs in Canada and the United States and is the main reference book for many Provincial and State Ski Lift Passenger Ropeway training programs. Selkirk has most recently shipped 40 copies of the text to the Australia Ski Areas Associations for training their resort operations staff.

The Ski Resort Operations and Management program will be entering its 30th year this September and is the longest running program of its kind in Canada. Needless to say, Peter has made major contributions to the success of the program and the numerous students that have graduated from it.

Cheese and Pear Quesadillas

- 4 whole wheat flour 8" tortillas
- ½ cup shredded Jack cheese
- ½ cup grated cheddar cheese
- 3 tbsp sliced fresh basil leaves
- 2 tbsp chopped sweet onion
- 1 USA pear, cored and thinly sliced
- 2 tsp olive oil



Directions:

On half of each tortilla, sprinkle one-fourth of cheeses, basil, and onion and top with pear slices. Fold each in half; brush both sides with olive oil and heat in non-stick skillet 2 to 3 minutes on each side, or until cheese melts and tortilla browns. Cut each into four pieces.

Makes 16 appetizers or four main dishes.

SEARCH ENGINE OPTIMIZATION TIPS

Tip #1

Did you know that there is some relevancy advantage in larger sites at the point that you begin to have around 100 pages or more indexed? Something seems to happen around the 100 page mark.

Remember to focus on building quality content of genuine value to your readers.

Tip #2

Titles are extremely important for success with most search engines. A title like "Charlie's cool site" may be fun, but "Boston Golf and Caddie Shop" will get 200 times the search engine hits. Usability hint: the text in your title is saved as a bookmark and should make sense to the surfer when seen there or on a search engine results page. It also helps people figure out where they are on your site. A well designed title has relevant keywords but is also a navigation aid.

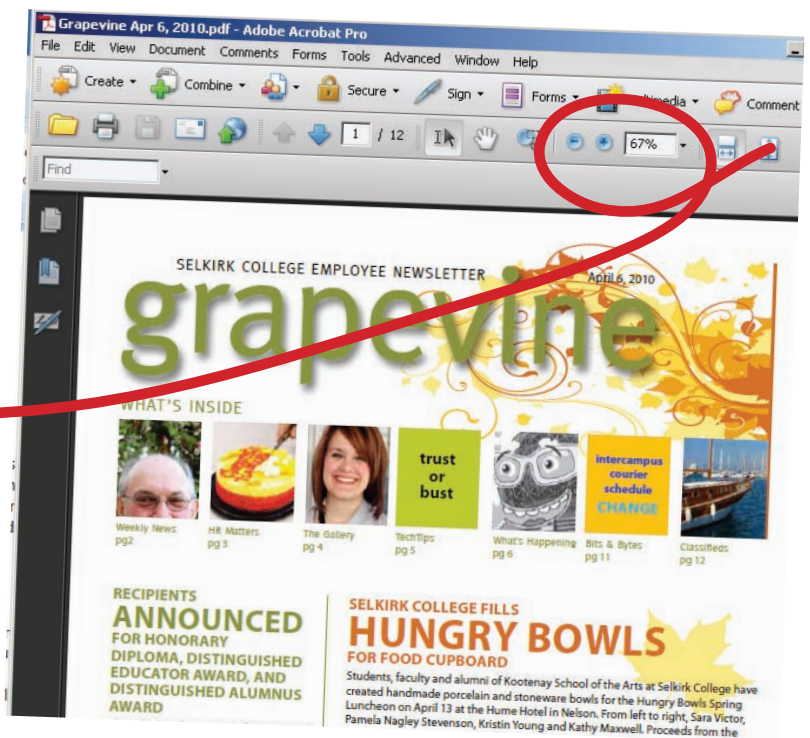
HOW TO VIEW THE GRAPEVINE

Have you ever tried to open the Grapevine, only to find that it is WAY too small to see, or WAY too big? Depending on your default settings in Adobe Acrobat Reader, the Grapevine may look wonky when you first open it.

This can easily be adjusted by finding the "zoom" function along the top of the screen. It looks like this:

Simply click on the "+" or "-" signs, OR on the arrow to see the entire drop-down menu. From here, you can choose how big or small you want your Grapevine to be.

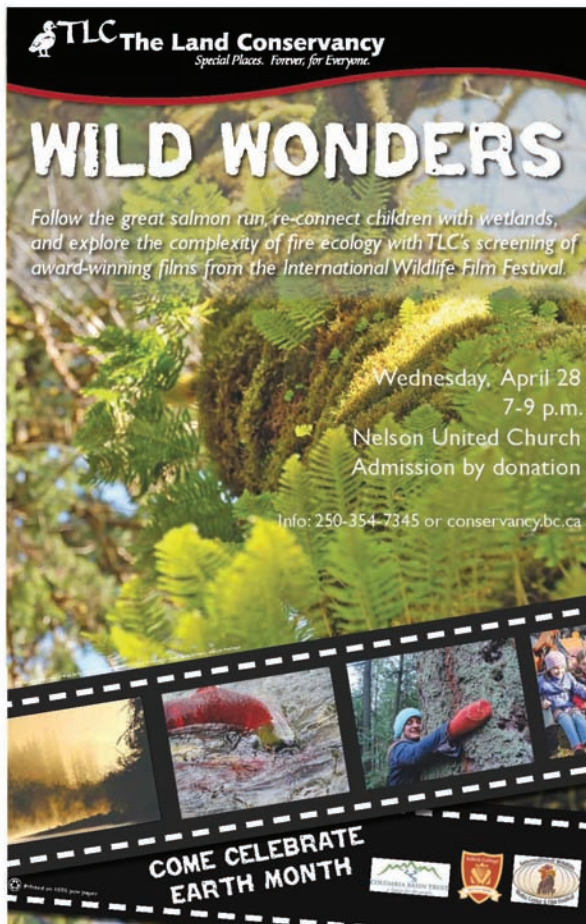


