

EARLY CHILDHOOD CARE AND EDUCATION PROGRAM APPLICATION INFORMATION LETTER

Selkirk College will be offering the next intake for Early Childhood Care and Education Program in September 2009. This program will be offered in a three semester, ten month format. Graduates will have the opportunity to ladder into the Human Services Diploma. The ECCE program offers students a practically based and developmentally sequenced curriculum with opportunities to work with children from infancy to school age under the guidance of college instructors. For a current program description and schedule, please refer to the Selkirk College Website (www.selkirk.ca).

Upon completion of the certificate, graduates are eligible to be registered as an assistant Early Childhood Educator in accordance with regulations of Community Care Facilities Licensing BC Ministry of Health. After 500 hours work experience individuals are eligible to receive a license to practice as an Early Childhood Educator.

Please read the enclosed Departmental policies concerning admission to our programs. You will note that in order to complete the application process, you should submit:

- an official copy of all pertinent secondary and post-secondary transcripts with English 12.
- a resume detailing educational, work, and volunteer background.
- two Human Services Department reference forms; completed by non-related individuals.
- a 60-hour work experience form completed by a teacher or supervisor of the program in which you were/are taking part. i.e. early childhood educator, work supervisor, etc.
- a completed Human Services department health information form.
- an official statement of criminal record.

Acceptance to the program is based on a "first come, first serve basis" given that the applicant meets all the requirements. Upon completion of the application package, you will be sent a letter of acceptance into the program.

All applicants whether the application package is complete or not, are encouraged to take part in a group orientation interview. You will be notified of the time, date, and place of your session.

Procedures for Criminal Record Checks

Many social service agencies require all prospective employees and practicum students to submit to a criminal record check.

A previous conviction for a criminal offence may prevent a practicum placement. Individuals working in licensed facilities or with children are required by law to provide a criminal record check.

If these requirements may be a problem for you, please consult the program instructors, Classroom and Community Support Worker program, to discuss the implications and options.

Instructions for completing the Consent for Disclosure of Criminal Record Information Form

- 1. This form is available at your local RCMP or City Police Station. You must have it completed, pick it up and return the completed form to Selkirk College.
- 2. You must initial every category of Information of Disclosure
- 3. You must also complete the Consent for a Criminal Record Check for a Sexual Offence for Which a Pardon has been Granted or Issued. This is part of the same Consent for Disclosure form and is necessary for all people who will be working with one or more children or vulnerable persons.
