	following day (Thursday) the FD was called and recommended evacuation. Facilities flushed out the air, and air scrubbers were used.
	Expectations were expressed to the contractor going forward with regards to the mishap and next time (as there needs to be a second coat applied) to
	provided better information so facilities is prepared to adjust the HVAC and other arrangements can be made to ensure the fumes are mitigated.
