

Survey Results for Data Collected from Course Registration Change Form, Fall 2016

Summary

This report contains a detailed statistical analysis of the results to the survey titled *Data Collected from Course Registration Change Form 2016/2017*.

Data from 134 forms were entered over the course of the Fall 2016 semester.

The majority of students who withdrew were domestic students (93%).

The majority of students withdrew from a course (98%), while only 2% withdrew from a program.

Reasons for Withdrawing

Students were asked to indicate their main reasons for withdrawing. The majority of students said they withdrew from their program or course due to a heavy course load (27%) or the program/course was not for me (12.5%).
