COURSE OBJECTIVES

To provide an accessible and practical training tool and to have participants understand the "big picture" of Risk Management to develop strategies and tactical plans for their area of responsibility.

Anyone with risk management responsibilities in Canadian ski resorts; risk managers, operations managers, ski patrollers, supervisors or managers in any department from Food & Beverage to Snow School.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

- Focus is on the risk management process vs. detailed "how to" for specific risks.
- Assignments will lead students through the development of a risk management plan for their department.
- Evaluation is primarily assignment based vs. exam based.
- Online discussions with industry peers create a participative learning experience.
